Reflections from this week's liturgy

Zechariah, one of the 12 minor prophets of the Old Testament, was a priest and he prophesied in the years 520 to 518 B.C. in Jerusalem, during the time of the Persian Empire's domination of Israel under King Darius the Great. Darius and his predecessor Cyrus had allowed Israel to go back to its homeland after many years of exile in Babylon, and they helped to rebuild the Temple of Jerusalem, called the Second Temple. Zechariah, whose name means “the Lord has remembered”, was exhorting the people of Israel to put away their arms and weapons, and to concentrate on the things of God, especially the rebuilding of the Temple of Jerusalem. He proclaims: “Rejoice o daughter of Zion, your king is coming, humble and seated on a donkey”, a prophecy fulfilled in our Lord Jesus, when he entered Jerusalem on what we now call Palm Sunday, followed by Christ's death and resurrection, inaugurating the new spiritual temple of God, the Church, present in all the world.
