Reflections from this week's liturgy

The book of Job is a reflection of our human condition. Yes, there are days when everything seems to go well, we are in a good mood, we feel healthy, the sun is shining and the weather is good, the neighbours are not bothering us, the streets are clean, the air is fresh, we have interesting things to do, we had a good night's sleep, there are no wars going on... Wait a minute, there are not too many days like that in our lives, most of our days have something negative about them, and in general we often have difficulties in relationships, in the family, financially, medically, psychologically, even in our faith, just as Job did: he says that his days are worthless and full of sorrow, and that they are passing by so quickly, as if in a strong wind. However, even after losing everything, Job had patience and did not lose his faith, and in his lifetime God rewarded him. Let us too have patience and faith like Job.
