Reflections from this week's liturgy

As we begin Holy Week, we think about Jesus' sufferings for our salvation and the salvation of the world, sufferings caused by the sins of humanity but necessary for our salvation. However, Jesus suffered not only physically (pain, thirst, exhaustion, bleeding) but also mentally (despair, anguish, false accusations, abandonment). When Jesus was in the Garden of Getsemani, he prayed that if possible this hour may not come, that he be spared of all this suffering, saying to his Father: "Abba, for you everything is possible, remove this chalice from me", but his Father did not answer. Jesus then asked his disciples to stay with him and pray with him, but they could not do this and fell asleep. Jesus was totally alone, seemingly abandoned by God and by mankind. Yet Jesus did not give up, he knew that he had to complete his mission, and said to his Father: "may it not be according to my will, but to yours". We too in our lives sometimes feel that no one, not even God, listens to us, but let us not despair, let us trust God, for he has a plan for us.
